These Are a Few Of Our Favorite Things.

It's been a long winter and an even longer spring, but finally it's here. Summer. And with it, most are coming back to the lake for more of what we look forward to all those long dark months of winter.

Hopefully, everyone remembers those important little details that make this a great place to call home. Just in case, or if we have any new people (which we do), here are some reminders:

When you're swimming, stay out of the boat lane. Either swim close to shore, stay near a swim raft or boat or, if you have to cross the boat lane, use common sense and be quick about it and don't do it when boats are going fast.

Watch out for wildlife. We are lucky enough to play host to a number of different sorts of waterfowl, most often talked about being loons, but there are a number of others. We have Grebes, mallards, for a few short days every spring we even have Swans. Keep your eyes up when hauling skiers or tubers and plan your path, and it shouldn't be a problem. If you have dogs, no it is not funny to let them chase the wildlife. Things like a hunter chasing a bird with young is stressful for the animals and we'd hate to drive them away or worse out of a few moments' thoughtlessness.

Watch out for each other and others' property. There are a number of off-lakers who have taken a shine to this

particular body of water and as often happens with higher traffic, we have already had some thefts this year. If you see someone suspicious, feel free to call the Sheriff. It's never a bad thing for people to see that there is a law enforcement presence here. It acts as its own deterrent.

Boaters travel in a counterclockwise direction. Use common sense and remember it's a small lake. If it's crowded, wait to pull your skier or tuber. It's more fun for everyone if nobody gets hurt.

Most importantly, have fun and enjoy the lake, it's why we're all here.
